# A guide to school uniform from September 2021



## Reasons for having a uniform

At Standens Barn Primary School we believe that a school uniform gives a sense of belonging and pride in the school, whilst ensuring equality amongst the children.

Additionally, a smart appearance contributes positively to the children's attitude to work, influence how the school is represented to the general public and also supports children in having the right attitude for future work.

This booklet is designed to support you to make the correct choices that help you comply with our school's uniform policy. We understand that money can be tight, so it is important to make sure you use this guide prior to purchasing any uniform.

There will be times, due to medical reasons, that some children may not be able to fully comply with the policy. We accept this and will work with parents to make the necessary adaptations. Please contact the school if this concerns your child.





## **Compulsory Items**

The following items are compulsory and must be worn at all times (except PE days).

Any uniform with the school logo must be purchased from school. - Green cardigan, jumper (sweatshirt) or fleece with school logo or plain bottle green without logo.
- Plain white polo shirt or blouse/shirt.
- Grey or black trousers or smart tailored shorts
- Grey or black skirt (knee length) or pinafore.
- Green gingham summer dress (green and white check).
- School book bag with school logo or rucksack from home.




## **Shoes**

All shoes must be formal, leather type, flat (no heels) and completely black. These examples are not exhaustive, but are representative of what is permitted under the uniform policy.

#### P E Uniform

We all agree that children coming dressed in their PE kits for the day of their lesson, is a good idea. It helps prevent clothing from becoming lost and also means that valuable PE lesson time is not taken up with two sets of changes.

However, it is important then that children are still dressed smartly and appropriately.

The following items are compulsory:

- Plain white t-shirt or the **NEW** school t-shirt with owl logo.
- Plain black jogging bottoms or leggings.
- Plain black shorts (or green if you already have these).
- Plain black hoodie or the **NEW** school hoodie with owl logo.
- Trainers

**No** football kits, or any other clothing items for PE, including multi coloured clothing or t-shirts with sequins or other logos.

Long hair should be tied up and earrings **MUST** be removed prior to the children coming to school.

Again this list is not exhaustive. Essentially any item of clothing that has a large logo, or is not predominately black is not allowed under our policy.
