Dear Parents and Carers,

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Parent/carer information events

We hope over the last term you have been able to attend some of our events that have been held across the school.

These have all provided a great opportunity for you to understand educational requirements, what your child is learning and how well they are progressing. It is incredibly valuable when our parents and carers show our children that we are working together to support their learning and also enables our children to become more successful. We also understand that, due to demands of your own jobs, you may not be able to attend during the school day so we have repeated meetings at different times and/or recorded them and then emailed the sessions so the information is available to all parents and carers.

Cycling to school- <u>new update</u>

It is wonderful to see many of our children walking, cycling or scootering to school and, whilst we actively encourage this, we want to ensure that all children understand how to keep themselves safe when doing so. Consequently, from Monday 30th October, if your child would like to bring their bike or scooter into school they must wear a helmet. Please use the next week to purchase one if they do not already have one. Thank you for your understanding and co-operation.

Parking

I would like to take this opportunity to remind you all to be Safe and Thoughtful when collecting or dropping your child(ren) off.

We understand that it can be very stressful in the mornings when we have to be in multiple places but it is vital that <u>ALL</u> car drivers remain courteous to all of those in our community and that they also drive and park within the law to ensure we do not hurt or harm anyone.

The Highway Code Rule 243 states that it is illegal to stop or park near the following:

- near a school entrance (including zig zag lines)
- anywhere you would prevent access for Emergency Services
- at or near a bus or tram stop or taxi rank
- on the approach to a level crossing/tramway crossing
- opposite or within 10 metres (32 feet) of a junction, except in an authorised parking space
- near the brow of a hill or hump bridge
- opposite a traffic island or (if this would cause an obstruction) another parked vehicle
- where you would force other traffic to enter a tram lane
- where the kerb has been lowered to help wheelchair users and powered mobility vehicles
- in front of an entrance to a property
- on a bend
- where you would obstruct cyclists' use of cycle facilities

Uniform information

We believe a school uniform gives our children a sense of belonging and encourages them to feel proud of the school they attend and it is wonderful to see that the overwhelming majority of you follow our school uniform policy.

Our PE uniform ensures that our children continue to represent our school and ethos of BEST, that they look smart and feel part of a bigger school community.

When children wear their school uniform we are always proud of how smart they look and we want to maintain this standard on PE days.

PE uniform should **ONLY** be worn on designated PE days or as directed by the class teacher and <u>not</u> on any other days. The PE kit should also be worn for before/after school sports clubs.

The PE uniform can be purchased via the Goodies app or you can buy the equivalent from alternative shops as long as it follows our expectations.

Our PE uniform consists of the following:

- plain white t-shirt or the <u>NEW</u> school t-shirt with owl logo
- black jogging bottoms or leggings
- black shorts (or green shorts if you already have these)
- black hoodie with school owl badge
- trainers or plimsolls
- hat for sunny days

Our uniform expectations are as follows:

- green cardigan or jumper
- fleece or cardigan with school owl logo (ordered through the main school office)
- white polo shirt or white plain white shirt or blouse
- grey or black trousers or tailored shorts (not sportswear)
- grey or black skirts or pinafores
- green gingham summer dress
- black flat school shoes (not white or coloured trainers or sandals in the summertime)
- rucksack/school bag or book bag with school owl logo (ordered through the main school office) to carry school items
- draw string bag with school owl logo (useful to carry trainers in if your child wishes to change footwear at lunchtimes to play football or to carry spare trainers for PE which can get muddy during the winter months)

Children should <u>not</u> wear jewellery other than stud earrings and/or a watch. Children should also <u>not</u> wear black or any other types of jeans or leggings. ALL jewellery, including stud earrings, MUST be removed on a PE day or your child will not be able to participate.



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We have had a fantastic first term and we are looking forward to what comes next throughout the rest of this academic year! Thank you to you all for your ongoing support and helping us achieve a great start and for being BEST!
