## Year 2 Curriculum

Term 3 is all about our capital city London. With the exception of Numeracy, Science and Computing all subjects will be linked to this theme in some way:

## Writing:

All of our texts and writing genres this term will be connected to the 'Our Great Capital' theme. Through these units of work, the children will develop their speaking and listening, reading and writing skills:

- Facts and Posters
- Great Fire of London and diary writing

Maths: Please continue to support your child at home in these areas;
We will continue to learn about shape this term, before moving on to money, then multiplication and division.

The London theme will be taught using a range of teaching methods to support and deepen the children's understanding.

In History, we will be learning about the events of The Great Fire of London, how we find out about things that happened in the past and primary and secondary sources.

In Geography we will learn about the characteristics of the four countries of the UK, we will use aerial views to look at London Landmarks and create a map.

In Science we will look at materials, their uses and properties.
In PSHE we will be learning about valuing differences in each other.

In Music the children will be learning about Pitch and Notation.
In Computing the children will be learning about Robot Algorithms.
In Art, the children will have a go at using line, tone and texture to complete their own London landmark artwork. They will compare two artists - Stephen Wiltshire and Yvonne Jaquette.

Children are required to come into school wearing their PE kit every THURSDAY
P.E. lessons will focus on attacking, defending and shooting activities.
