Costs in schools

Over the past couple of years, we have a seen a staggering rise in costs for our school trips both from the venues themselves but also with the price of coaches.

For many years, we have been able to subsidise the cost of these trips but, unfortunately, we are unable to continue to do this.

Whilst there has been an increase in the trips themselves, we have also been affected by a huge rise in our utility bill costs, staffing costs and a low birth rate (meaning we have got lower class sizes in some year groups which decreases the amount per pupil that we receive). Increased costs have not been supported by the government and these factors are affecting many schools nationally with many having to make difficult decisions to secure their futures.

I therefore wanted to express my gratitude to you all for supporting us in enabling us to provide your child(ren) with an excellent and varied curriculum and wider experiences. Without your willingness to pay the total amounts for these trips or donating money for our discoes and Winter Barnanza, we would be unable to continue to provide these exciting opportunities.

These are values that can also be used in the home-consistency helps children to understand boundaries and BEST can be useful reminders if they are perhaps not following your expectations but can also be used as reasons when offering praise and rewards.

The children have signed their BEST class agreements, and we will continue to embed BEST in all parts of school life everyday throughout the school year and remind our children that 'The true test of BEST is how we behave when no one is watching'.

Our Friday assemblies are one of my favourite parts of the week, I really enjoy seeing our children succeed and be Brave enough to share their accomplishments with the rest of our school. 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Reminder- Cycling to school

It is wonderful to see many of our children walking, cycling or scootering to school and, whilst we actively encourage this, we want to ensure that all children understand how to keep themselves safe when doing so. Please remember that, if your child would like to bring their bike or scooter into school, they **must** wear a helmet. Thank you for your understanding and co-operation.

Reminder- Parking

I would like to take this opportunity to remind you all to be Safe and Thoughtful when collecting or dropping your child(ren) off.

We understand that it can be very stressful in the mornings when we have to be in multiple places but it is vital that <u>ALL</u> car drivers remain courteous to all of those in our community and that they also drive and park within the law to ensure we do not hurt or harm anyone.

The Highway Code Rule 243 states that it is illegal to stop or park near the following:

- near a school entrance (including zig zag lines)
- anywhere you would prevent access for Emergency Services
- at or near a bus or tram stop or taxi rank
- on the approach to a level crossing/tramway crossing
- opposite or within 10 metres (32 feet) of a junction, except in an authorised parking space
- near the brow of a hill or hump bridge
- opposite a traffic island or (if this would cause an obstruction) another parked vehicle
- where you would force other traffic to enter a tram lane
- where the kerb has been lowered to help wheelchair users and powered mobility vehicles
- in front of an entrance to a property
- on a bend
- where you would obstruct cyclists' use of cycle facilities

Uniform information

We believe a school uniform gives our children a sense of belonging and encourages them to feel proud of the school they attend and it is wonderful to see that the overwhelming majority of you follow our school uniform policy.

Our PE uniform ensures that our children continue to represent our school and ethos of BEST, that they look smart and feel part of a bigger school community.

When children wear their school uniform we are always proud of how smart they look and we want to maintain this standard on PE days.

PE uniform should **ONLY** be worn on designated PE days or as directed by the class teacher and <u>not</u> on any other days. The PE kit should also be worn for before/after school sports clubs.

The PE uniform can be purchased via the Goodies app or you can buy the equivalent from alternative shops as long as it follows our expectations.

Our PE uniform consists of the following:

- plain white t-shirt or the <u>NEW</u> school t-shirt with owl logo
- black jogging bottoms or leggings
- black shorts (or green shorts if you already have these)
- black hoodie with school owl badge
- trainers or plimsolls
- hat for sunny days

Our uniform expectations are as follows:

- green cardigan or jumper
- fleece or cardigan with school owl logo (ordered through the main school office)
- white polo shirt or white plain white shirt or blouse
- grey or black trousers or tailored shorts (not sportswear)
- grey or black skirts or pinafores
- green gingham summer dress
- black flat school shoes (**not** white or coloured trainers or sandals in the summertime)
- rucksack/school bag or book bag with school owl logo (ordered through the main school office) to carry school items
- draw string bag with school owl logo (useful to carry trainers in if your child wishes to change footwear at lunchtimes to play football or to carry spare trainers for PE which can get muddy during the winter months)

Children should <u>not</u> wear jewellery other than stud earrings and/or a watch. Children should also <u>not</u> wear black or any other types of jeans or leggings. ALL jewellery, including stud earrings, MUST be removed on a PE day or your child will not be able to participate.



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We have had a fantastic first term and we are looking forward to what comes next throughout the rest of this academic year!

Please continue to check your emails, our school website and social media for updates about the curriculum offer for your child and about what they are learning. Please remember that if your child would like to bring their bike or scooter into school, they <u>must</u> wear a helmet.

We are committed to BEST and treating you with respect and courtesy and to be Thoughtful to you all. Our staff also have the right to work in a safe environment, so we ask that you treat them thoughtfully and with respect and courtesy. Offensive behaviour will result in you being asked to leave and may result in prosecution.
